In this edition Christine Welch echoes a similar sentiment pointing out that "... Western scholarship has defined itself in terms of discrete disciplines, and academics have been encouraged to define themselves according to recognized disciplines - 'I am a physicist' 'My subject is economic history' etc. Now we need to pay greater attention to the 'in-between' zone - to interdisciplinary research that focuses on relationships, causes and connections"

In addition to Christine's selected papers we have, what I hope will become regular features, a book review and "The Last Word".

I hope that you enjoy this edition.
