The paper "A Proposal for UTAUT Model Extension in the Virtual Learning Environments use as Presential Learning Support Context" presents a theoretical contribution to the extension of the UTAUT model in the context of virtual learning environments. The paper "Infrastructure Profiles and Knowledge Sharing" presents a field study that analyses the role of information technologies and top management concerning knowledge sharing.
