Their central argument is:

- Evaluate some potentially new, revised, and improved models such as direct primary care (DPC), accounting care organizations (ACO), corporate partnerships models, and other optimal patient care related models.
- Suggest feasible policy recommendations toward a more sustainable national healthcare system.

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Specifically, the objectives of the book consist of the:

- Comprehensive coverage of healthcare reform.
- Development of new models of healthcare system/s.
- Presentation of the views and perspectives of key stakeholders.

In this context, taking into account that a healthcare reform typically attempts to improve healthcare quality by focusing upon:

- Medical coverage increase
- Cost containment
- Insurance reform
- The philosophy of healthcare provision
- Funding
- Government involvement

The organization, coherence, cohesion, and mechanics of the book 'Evaluating Challenges and Opportunities for Healthcare Reform' appropriately substantiate the objectives of the editors as they explain the context of the healthcare reform connecting it to the broader development.

Specifically, Section 1 explores some innovative, new, enhanced healthcare models, including the latest shifts in healthcare toward patient-centricity and emerging transformations in the healthcare field. Section 2 addresses some of the challenges and opportunities that emerge in the discussions and decision-making deliberations of healthcare reform. In Section 3, authors have made some recommendations related to interprofessionality, professionalism competence, and continuous improvement in the US medical education continuum.

Although beyond the scope of the book and with the learning curve on this topic still unfolding, the book 'Evaluating Challenges and Opportunities for Healthcare Reform' provides some useful insights which are related to the challenges and opportunities concerning telemedicine adoption.

Last but not least, the book is well-written, the editors have accomplished their purpose; the vision of the book is timely, its approach most needed. The content is immediately amenable to the evolving reform ideas regarding healthcare systems as well as previous reform discussions of the healthcare system, which could be summarized as follows:

- Use of comparative effectiveness research.
- Reform of doctor's incentives.
- Insurance reforms.
- Tax reform.
- Independent advisory panels.
- Lowering obesity.
- Rationing of care.
- Medical malpractice costs and limits on redress.
- Addressing the shortage of doctors, nurses and hospital capacity, and Medicare fraud.
- Single-payer payment system.
- Privatize Medicare with a voucher system.
